I am always pleased to get a recommendation regarding information on Moffat, and a friend who is a rail enthusiast, made a connection with my being in Clan Moffat and recommended the above author and his short stories, the first being a railway journey from London to Moffat.

This short story is about a 'Moffat son' living in London who was accompanied by his wife and brother who wanted to take him home at the end of his life. The train journey depicted reminded me of my first railway journey to Moffat and the various stations passed through, and scenery not too different after all these years.

A good advertisement for Moffat, the author talks about 'the bonny hills', and after 'three days in Moffat you will be 'earty as you ever were'. The author sadly has not had the recognition he should have had for his talent. He was held in high esteem by all his contemporary writers and greatly respected as Cunningham Graham had a way of 'painting word pictures'.

He was a Politician, writer, journalist, and traveller (1852-1936). His family home was in Ardoch and Dumbarton. A fascinating man, a Liberal and then Leader of the Scottish Labour Party as well as its first President. A man who had a sense of justice and humanity – championing the causes of the poor and oppressed, with a high regard for freedom and a deep love for his fellow man. An extraordinary man!

Publicity for Clan Moffat UK

Since taking over the role of publicity officer I have been trying to find new ways of publicising the Clan to increase our membership.

I started out in September 2019 whilst attending Braemar Highland Games and placed an advert in a local eaterie called the Hungry Highlander hoping that a "Royal" Moffat might call in. Only local news was allowed to be placed on notice boards in the region.

Also in September we visited St Germain en Laye in France, twinned with Ayr, which was holding its first ever Highland Games complete with Pipe Bands from Paris. There are Scottish connections here as St Germain was Mary Queen of Scots childhood home and also later the exiled Jacobite Court. A copy of our ad is in the Hotel du Ville in St Germain. A copy will also go up in Ayr Library.

I sent a copy of the ad to a friend in New Zealand and it is up in Kaipoi and Rangiora Libraries just outside Christchurch. She said the local libraries were delighted to help and an announcement was made on the Kaipoi Residents Facebook Page. She also emailed the City Library in Christchurch. They responded by saying that they had passed on the ad to 18 libraries. We would welcome "kiwi" Moffats!

To date I am waiting for responses from the City Libraries in Melbourne Australia and Vancouver Canada and the Scottish Field publication. If the libraries only put up local news I will contact tourist offices in these areas. The Scots Magazine published our ad both in their May and June editions and said they would welcome any further information regarding the Clan which they would pass on to their advertising department for future publication. I will also place ads in local newspapers and welcome any suggestions that committee members might have.

As many Moffats originated in and around the East Coast of Scotland our Ads will be posted up in various libraries and museums e.g. Edinburgh, Musselburgh, Tranent, Haddington. Our American friends will be familiar I am sure with John Muir and when the John Muir Museum in Dunbar opens I intend to take one there and also visit the Musselburgh and Moffat Museums. Piping during Lockdown

Although naturally I was disappointed not to be able to play my pipes at the gathering this year and I have missed playing with other pipers in the bands I have been involved in, I have nevertheless had a number of positive experiences.

This time last year I had not long returned from a week in Glasgow for the Piping Live Festival and the World Pipe Band Championships on Glasgow Green. Although all the events were cancelled this year, Piping Live and The Piping Centre organised an online festival involving two solo competitions, a folk concert and three talks about piping. It was very enjoyable and informative.

I played outside my house at eight o'clock on ten Thursday evenings as part of the thank you to the NHS. After the ten weeks my neighbours asked if I could continue to play on Thursday evenings. I have done so every Thursday since apart from one evening when there was torrential rain. The pattern is that I play about eight tunes at my front door while the neighbours stand on the pavement by my front wall. Passers by sometimes stop to listen and recently a couple from a nearby street who heard me on their evening walk have joined the regulars. After the playing the neighbours chat for an hour or so. People feel that it has provided an opportunity for neighbours to spend time together and get to know each other better. It has helped my piping as I try to play something new each week so it gives me a focus for my practice. I am fortunate that



my next door neighbours like pipes and don't mind that since Lockdown I practice in the house every day and not in a local church. There have been three occasions when I have



played my pipes as part of a national tribute. First there was VE Day when I played "When the Battle's O'er " outside my house. Pipers world wide were invited to play that tune at 3PM. The second was joining the national tribute on 12th June to the 51st Highland Division, the forgotten heroes of Dunkirk who stayed on after the evacuation to fight alongside the French. The tune played that day was "The Heroes of St Valery". The third occasion was when I took part in the national tribute on VJ Day. I played "When the Battle's O'er " at 6AM in a nearby churchyard where there are seventeen WW2 graves. It was quite misty that morning and very atmospheric. I also played again outside my house at 10.30 AM. Much as I feel my piping has benefitted from these experiences, I

am really looking forward to a time when I can return to some of the piping activities I have enjoyed before.

We know you have already done this! However we do seek to promote the Clan and improve our communications and engagement with members. We would welcome any help you might be able to give.
